Speaker: Glenn Hegar Texas Comptroller

Glenn Hegar was elected as Texas Comptroller of Public Accounts in November 2014.

Glenn is a sixth-generation Texan who grew up farming land that has been in his family since the mid-1800s. He's a 1993 graduate of Texas A&M University and earned his law degree at St. Mary's University. Glenn has served in the Texas Legislature, where he worked on issues including public education, transportation, tax reform, government transparency, Second

Amendment rights, water issues and tort reform.

As comptroller, Glenn is chief finance officer for the world's ninth-largest economy. He has emerged as a passionate advocate for conservative financial management and government transparency who has focused on creating a more efficient and customer oriented agency. He founded the state's Transparency Stars program, pushed for smarter ways of investing our rainy day fund to protect it for future generations, and guided the formation of the nation's first ever state-administered precious metals depository.

His upbringing taught him the core values of hard work, honesty and integrity — the same values he and his wife Dara work to instill in their three young children, Claire, Julia and Jonah. Hegar's most important title throughout his years of service is the one closest to home: Dad!



May Meeting Minutes

Burnet County Republican Women PAC Minutes of General Meeting – May 13, 2021

Sylvester H. Reed Memorial Building - Burnet, Texas

Welcome, Call to Order, and Opening Ceremonies: President Mary Jane Avery welcomed everyone and called the meeting to order at 11:35 a.m. A lunch of green salad, grilled chicken, pasta dishes and chocolate cake was served. Chaplain Sue Boss Lee gave the invocation, and County Clerk Janet Parker led the pledges to the American and Texas flags.

Introductions: President Mary Jane introduced local elected officials, precinct chairs, and guests.

Approval of Minutes and Treasurer's Report: The April minutes were published in the newsletter. There were no corrections. They stand approved as published.

Membership Report: Membership Chair Janice Estill reported that we have 110 members and 27 associate members. She introduced a new Membership Team comprised of representatives from six sections of the county. Their job is to recruit more new members and to keep all new members involved.

Caring for America: Chair Deborah Smith reported that \$385 was donated to purchase a TV for the Highland Lakes Pregnancy Center office. She thanked everyone for the donations.

Campaign Activities: Campaign Activities Chair Mary Jane recognized members who participated in political activities during this legislative session. She read a thank you note from Ellen Ott thanking us for our contributions to the border project. A Strike Force trip to Arlington, CD-6 is planned for July. More information to follow.

Program: Gail Teegarden introduced our speaker Robbi Hull, TFRW Vice President of Legislation. Robbi explained TFRW's priorities for this legislative session and the reason TFRW is so important. There were three priorities: redistricting, election integrity, and civics education. For redistricting, Texas gets two more House seats. In regards to election integrity, SB 7 will go to the governor, and Texas will have election integrity. There is a bill SB 1589 that would create a state election marshal and marshals for each DPS district to report election fraud. This bill may have to wait until the next legislative session because redistricting takes priority. There are three bills that address civics education. Robbi is working on getting something passed.

Scholarship Presentations: Scholarship Chair Wanda Kauffman explained that we have a chili cookoff to earn scholarship money. She thanked committee members Jane Marie Hurst and Marianne Berry. Our 2021 scholarship recipients are Haley McMann from Burnet High School, Hannah Jordan from Marble Falls High School, and Gus Henry from Faith Academy. Wanda introduced the recipients and their parents. Each recipient read his/her essay.


DEBORAH SMITH



Congressional Update



President Biden Must Resign

August 26th, 2021 is a day Americans must never forget. It's the day 13 Marines, Soldiers, and Navy Corpsmen, would make the ultimate sacrifice in Afghanistan. They gave their lives so others may live, the most noble form of selflessness human beings will ever know. They did everything we asked of them, left their families and worldly possessions behind to serve a cause bigger than themselves. War is messy, inhumane, and hard to understand, but what is unfolding before our eyes in Afghanistan is not just the fog of war, it's an utter display of incompetence from the Commander in Chief, President Joe Biden.

How do we tell 13 new Gold Star Families that the President did all he could, when we know he didn't? American servicemembers were positioned outside of Hamid Karzai International Airport (HKIA) just feet from their Taliban and ISIS-K enemies. They were outfitted with small arms and individual protection, pitted against an enemy that was just gifted thousands of vehicles, heavy weapons, and warfighting equipment as a result of the Biden Administration's cowardly incompetence and hasty withdrawal. We don't have a leader in the White House, we have a social activist 20 years past his prime. Two decades of blood and treasure sacrificed in Afghanistan, and in just weeks President Biden squandered every American advantage and discredited our reputation among world leaders.

President Biden doesn't just owe the American people answers on why this mission was so catastrophic, he needs to be held accountable for what he and his Cabinet have done. I have no faith in President Biden, Secretary of Defense Lloyd Austin, or Secretary of State Anthony Blinken. At every juncture they've been wrong, and it's past time that Americans demand that their inability to discharge their duties does not result in additional loss of American lives. President Biden should immediately terminate the Secretaries of Defense and State, and Members of Congress on both sides should demand President Biden's resignation. No options should be off the table to prevent this Administration from making another consequential and disastrous foreign policy decision.

If President Biden will not resign, legally removing him from office must be considered. The 25th Amendment should be considered, as should impeachment. The Taliban is growing more violent, ISIS-K's malign influence is growing in the region, we've got American citizens and servicemembers in harm's way, all the while America has a remarkably incapable President at the helm.

My Vote Against Federalizing Our Elections

This week the House of Representatives passed H.R. 4, which imposes strict, federally controlled rules on how states run their own election systems. It specifically allows the Department of Justice to veto state's election integrity laws, like common-sense voter

ID requirements. I voted NO on this unconstitutional bill and oppose the efforts for Washington D.C. bureaucrats to tell Texas and other states how to run their own election processes.

Pelosi's Spending Spree

Speaker Pelosi called all members back into session not to address the Afghanistan crisis, the crime crisis, or the inflation crisis, but to pass another tax-and-spending spree bill. The partisan, Bernie Sanders-approved \$3.5 Trillion spending bill allows another \$16 trillion of debt and creates the highest sustained spending level in American history. This plan drops military funding to lowest levels, directs 0 funding to the Department of Homeland security to help address the border, gives amnesty to illegals, and enacts progressive Green New Deal policies. This bill will kill American jobs and only make the inflation crisis, border crisis, and energy crisis worse.

Training Center of Central Texas Graduation

It was an honor to deliver the commencement address for TX-25's Training Center of Central Texas graduation. From homebuilders, medical professionals, to electricians, the programs offered at the Center gives Texans the tools they need for a prosperous career. I am proud of all the graduates and am confident they will be successful in whatever lies ahead.

Meeting the New 26th SWA President

I enjoyed meeting with the new Southwest Adventist University President, Ana Patterson. I am confident in her leadership and her commitment to serve God and her students through her new position.

Visit to the Comanche Peak Nuclear Power Plant

I met with leadership from Comanche Peak Nuclear Plant in Glen Rose, TX and received a briefing on the February storm challenges and a recent fire incident that occurred at the plant and knocked out a reactor. The plant provides essential electricity to markets in 20 states and the District of Columbia, serving nearly 4.3 million residential, commercial, and industrial retail customers with electricity and natural gas.
