

Burnet County Republican Women PAC Minutes of General Meeting –December 10, 2020 Sylvester H. Reed Memorial Building – Burnet, Texas

Recognition of Officials, Guests, and New Members: Elected officials, precinct chairs, and TFRW officers introduced themselves. Guests and new members were also introduced. She also introduced Shannon, Terry Wilson's wife as a guest in his place due to a conflict. President Kay thanked them so much for providing for the meal at our meeting today and how much we appreciated it. Special Remarks: President Kay came forward to address the group for the last time as president. She went through her list of all members that had stepped forward to help her through the two years of her service. She especially wanted everyone to remember Ginny Wortham, our Secretary, who we lost in April and for JoAnn Meyer who was such a help to the club until her illness. And she thanked Gail, Mary Jane, Kara and Londa. She told them that we had been a great team, working so well together. Kay ended with a statement that she is so proud to call us all friends and wanted to say thanks.

Business Meeting:

Approval of Minutes and Treasurer's Report: The minutes of the November 2020 meeting as recorded by Janice Estill, Secretary, were approved as published. Carolyn Richmond announced that the club balance as of December 1, 2020 is \$17, 489.60. Of that balance we have a total of \$6,098.09 that we have reserved for scholarships, leaving a real operating balance of \$11, 391.51.

Committee Reports:

Membership: Janice Estill, membership chair reported that we currently have a membership of 68 and 19 associates.

By-laws: Janet Crow, Bylaws chair had nothing to report

Legislation: Roxanne Nelson was not present.

Campaign Activities: Mary Jane Avery, chair reported that we currently have 10 people that have signed up to go to Georgia to block walk for the senators. She asked that those people stand. She then announced that there were several contributions to our costs for this event. Several individuals including Trixie and Mark, Craig Cosgray, Horseshoe Bay Republican Women, A.B. and Elizabeth Walters and other anonymous gifts. We thank them for this gift. Mary Jane asked the Eagles Nest neighborhood and other members for doing— "post cards from home" to stand and honored them for the time they volunteered.

Caring for America: President Kay talked about our offer of monies for the Burnet County Child Welfare Board. Kay sent around two green baskets and asked for donations.

County Chair: Kara Chasteen, Burnet County Republican Party Chair announced that there would be a meeting of the executive board on Monday, December 14, 2020 at the Agri-Life Bldg in Burnet.

BCRW: Londa Chandler, President said she had no report but that we would return to the regular quarterly meetings after COVID-19 restrictions are lifted. **New Business**: Burnet County Officials will be sworn in on Friday, January 1 at 9:00 at the Burnet County Court House (2nd floor). This year Londa Chandler will be the lead Hostess and a sign-up sheet is located in the back of the room. This concluded our business meeting.

Gail Teegarden for standing in as VP; Janice for taking over Secretary after Ginny Wortham's death; Carolyn Richmond for serving as our treasurer since 2014; Mary Jane for serving as Campaign Activities Chair; Roxanne Nelson for serving as legislation chair; Janice for taking over as membership chair; Joann Myers for serving as publicity/technology chair and Mary Jane for taking over when JoAnn became ill; Janet Crow for outstanding work as By-Laws Chair; Darlene Hargett who has done scholarship for so long; and Patty Lueducke who always remembers how things were done and has great ideas for moving ahead. A special thank you and gift was presented to Dottie Stueckroth for securing the headquarters space and managing the work schedules, campaign gear and signs

Special Guest and Program: President Kay asked Mary Jane Avery to come

forward and introduce the special guests. Mary Jane told the group about how during the work we were doing for Lucio Valdez, we became almost like family. Lucio came forward and told us that his family members were all helping but he still needed help. Then Terry Wilson asked him if we could help. Lucio was so surprised at how much we were able to do for him. He was very thankful and wants us all to keep "Texas Red". Shannon Wilson came forward and apologized for Terry not being able to come but she told how much he thinks of this group.



Legislative Priorities - RPT

Last July, delegates to the State Republican Party of Texas voted on eight Legislative Priorities they want to see passed into law this upcoming legislative session These eight priorities are:

Election Integrity

Require citizenship verification of each voter, and felony penalties for Election Code violations that threaten election integrity.

Religious Freedom

Restore the rights of individuals, organizations, and businesses, to exercise their sincerely held religious beliefs by prohibiting local ordinances, state laws, or executive orders that violate those rights.

Children and Gender Modification

Abolish the following practices for minors: intervention to prevent natural

progression of puberty; administration of opposite sex hormones; and performance of any type of gender reassignment surgery.

Abolition of Abortion

Abolish abortion by ensuring the right to life and equal protection of the laws to all preborn children from the moment of fertilization.

Constitutional Carry

Restore legal Texas firearms owners' rights to carry them openly or concealed without a permit, while maintaining the option of a permit for reciprocity purposes.

Monument Protection

All monuments or markers in our state shall be protected by law from being removed, defaced, destroyed, or otherwise dishonored. In particular, specific protection shall be given to the Alamo Cenotaph which shall not be removed from its current location off the Alamo Battlefield footprint.

School Choice for All

Empower parents and guardians to choose from public, private, charter, or homeschool options for their children's education using tax credits or exemptions without government restraint or intrusion

Ban Taxpayer-Funded Lobbying

Abolish all forms of taxpayer-funded lobbying.

Chairman West, with the vigorous urging of many Texas Republican voters, has also charged us with an additional priority: reigning in executive power. This priority calls on the legislature to curtail the power of the governor to extend the Disaster Act and enable local officials to enact restrictions on individual liberties of Texans. Our citizens -- especially our vulnerable populations of children and seniors -- are suffering due to isolation, and mask and other unscientific mandates. Small businesses are being destroyed from occupancy and other unconstitutional ordinances. This must stop.

The purpose of the State Republican Executive Committee (SREC) is to ensure our elected officials are passing legislation that reflects our principles and Party platform. The Legislative Priorities Committee is responsible for working with our Republican legislators to craft and pass the priorities as designated by our delegates every two years at the state convention. We also inform and equip our Republican voters with actions they can carry out to support the passage of these priorities.

To that end, as Chair of the Legislative Priorities Committee, I will update you weekly on progress. We measure success as passing each one of these priorities, and expect our Republican representatives and senators to rise to the occasion this session to work in concert with the will of the Republican voters who put them in office.

The Democrats have come out of the gate quickly filing a number of bills that are in opposition to our priorities. But Democrats did not win the state of Texas in this past election, Republicans did, so we will seize this opportunity to keep Texas free through fair elections. We will restore our religious liberties and keep our children alive and safe and educated as parents see

fit. We will ensure our Second Amendment rights are unhindered, and our monuments intact as they remind us of our history, mistakes included. Finally, we will make sure citizens do not pay lobbyists to work against our interests.

The failure of the last legislative session -- to enact the will of the Party that won the State House, Senate, and Governor's office -- must not repeat itself this session. And our Capitol must be open to the people of the State of Texas, as specified in the Texas Constitutions, with no restrictions.

These are challenging times, and truly we are on the verge of losing to those who want socialism and a compliant populace. However, we are Texans, and with God's grace, we can save Texas. The first thing you can do is call your state representative, state senator, and the governor's office and ask that they open the Capitol and pass these Legislative Priorities!
